22/23 Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

Owing to classes isolating and the impact on staffing in the previous academic year, 2022-23 plan builds from the previous year.

An ongoing strength last year was that for the most part, all children had access to at least 2 hours of PE each week. These lessons took part outside as much as possible to reduce Covid risk however took place inside if needed. All lessons were taught in accordance to the risk assessment which included regular cleaning of equipment after sessions and regular hand sanitising before and after sessions by all children. The children finished the year happy and thoroughly enjoyed being able to do PE regularly again and with more variety as restrictions eased.

Another strength was the ongoing outdoor learning which included residentials, a camping trip, Forest schools and the training of more staff members.

Covid had a major impact on PE throughout the year. Due to ongoing Covid restrictions, staff absences and covid measures which had to be in place, children continued to miss out on key skills. There continued to be a lack of opportunities to compete competitively with other schools. This will again be a focus for this year. In addition, due to the Covid-19 impact, we are still playing catch-up with swimming lessons but hope to be back on track by the end of this academic year.
