Clarendon Road Primary School Sports Premium Strategy 2023-24

The following builds on some targets from the previous year but also focuses on new targets designed to increase staff confidence, knowledge and skills in delivering PE in a sustainable way and to have cohesive, progressive planning that enables them to deliver high quality PE sessions on a weekly basis.

Ongoing strengths continue in that for the most part, all children had access to at least 2 hours of PE each week. The children finished the year happy and thoroughly enjoy being able to do PE regularly.

Another strength was the ongoing outdoor learning which included residentials, a camping trip, Forest schools and the training of more staff members.

School is now looking to build capacity and capability in school in terms of promoting healthy lifestyles, increasing participation in competitive sport and providing staff with quality assured CPD. To further build on pupil engagement and enjoyment of sport, we are looking to incorporate a range of sport experiences across the school year.
